### **President's Report**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The ballots were counted on December 4, 2020 the results are on this newsletter. I am thankful for your continued support as your President for the next three years, I commit to doing my best for the branch members and continued working to ensuring the branch has strong representation for all members. This year has been a hard year for all of us with Covid-19 and the challenges this has posed to the members and the branch, yet we have persevered at work and at the branch office with your help and activism from retired and active members. The new year may present challenges that we will face but I am confident we will continue to move forward in strength and unity as we have in the past. I want to Con-gratulate Mark Follet as Vice President, Pete Tadeo, JC Mena, Kimberly Davis, Tiffany Eggert, and Mike Donnelly as trustees for the branch. I look forward to working with those elected by acclamation in October and those voted into positions to the Executive Board, together ensuring the NALC Branch 704 continues to be healthy, strong, inclusive, and working in "solidarity" for the betterment of the members. I thank you for your vote of confidence, and I am deeply honored.

Covid-19 in Tucson is affecting more postal employees than in July when we hit the highest count in the city and at the post office. The virus is very contagious, in some instances one employee will have symptoms and go get tested to come up with a positive diagnosed only to find out that those friends they took breaks with, also came up positive. We can look forward to the end of the virus at some point now that a vaccine has been made, unfortunately it will be months before enough people have had the vaccine to hopefully see any results. Meanwhile the virus is very much a part of our lives both at work and at home, which still requires us to be careful of catching the virus and bringing it to family or friends. By the numbers: The District for AZ and NM is at presumed confirmed COVID-19 cases (643) and under observation for COVID-19 (441). Tucson has 81 cases since November 1 to present that have been impacted due to covid-19, In the news medical officials are stating the number will go higher in the coming months, I encourage everyone to wear the masks, and social distance for yourself and family and friends. To those members that have lost family this year either due to Covid-19 or other causes I send my heartfelt condolences to you and your families.

We have a Tentative National Agreement between NALC and USPS, to read the agreement go to the NALC@ORG or check the NALC Bulletin posted at your station. I want to send a thank you to our National Officers for their hard work in negotiating a tentative National Agreement, the countless hours and days preparing and attending negotiations with President Fred Rolando's leadership has provided us a very good contract. Once our members have had a chance to read it and decide whether or not to accept the tentative agreement there will be a ratification vote. The Executive Council unanimously recommends ratification of this contract. The tentative agreement provides four annual general wage increases and seven cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs). In addition, effective Nov. 19, 2022, a new top step (Step P) will be added to the career letter carrier pay scales, which will be \$444 annually greater than Step O. The agreement also provides for the automatic conversion of city carrier assistants (CCAs) to career status no later than after 24 months of relative standing, providing full fringe benefits and peace of mind to non-career carriers. It also maintains existing protections against

subcontracting and layoffs. These are just some of what is on the tentative agreement, to read all the proposals on the agreement go to NALC.ORG as there is too much for the newsletter.

I was disappointed we couldn't have the December branch meeting Dinner in the hall unfortunately restaurants are not providing meals for large gatherings at this time. At the December Branch meeting the 2021 Branch Budget was voted and approved by the members. We will have Stewards Elections at Silverbell. Cherrybell. Desert Foothills. Coronado, and Casa Grande and Coolidge. The results of the elections for those stations will be posted in next month's newsletter. Stewards that were elected by acclamation at stations, I want to thank you for your continued dedication to representing members and all your hard work enforcing the contract and the new stewards coming on board I extend my welcome. I congratulate you and commend your efforts on behalf of the branch and the membership.

And it's easy to get in vegetables, such as sweet potatoes, carrots, broccoli, spinach, and red bell peppers, that are plentiful all winter. Citrus fruits are a great source of vitamin C, which stimulates production of infection-fighting antibodies.
